

# Wet weather got you and your plants down?

## Problems:

- yellowing leaves that wither and drop off
- plant looks wilted even though it is wet enough
- plant roots are blackened and soft
- growth is stunted or seeds fail to germinate at all
- plants are showing signs of rot and other fungal problems

## Why is this happening?

TOO MUCH RAIN!!!

Soil has become waterlogged, blocking oxygen from the plant roots. This prevents the roots from growing and leads to rot. This also creates a perfect environment for fungal and disease issues.

## How can I help my plants?

- Don't water unless soil is dry!
- Remove any dead or decaying plant material to prevent spread
- Allow good air circulation between plants in the garden
- Use fertilizer often to keep plants healthy and promote new vigorous growth (We recommend Miracle Grow or Osmocote)
- Use a fungicide as a preventative for leaf molds and other fungal problems on established plants (We recommend "Ready to Use" Fung-onil or Sulfur Dust)

Hopefully these tips will help ease your wet gardening woes. Remember that the rain will eventually calm down and your garden will recover!
