For indoor use:

- *Before bringing inside, keep your plant in a cool, non-freezing, non-heated, enclosed porch or garage for 3 or 4 days.
- *Bring your plant into the house. This plant should be in the house no longer than 7 to 10 days to prevent loss of dormancy and growth. Place in the coolest part of the room, away from heating ducts, wood stoves or cold drafts.
- *Keep root system evenly moist, but not soaking wet while in the house... one or two thorough waters while inside should be adequate.
- *Remove from house after 7 to 10 days and place back in the cool, non-freezing, non-heated enclosed porch or garage for 3 or 4 days to acclimate to temperatures.

For outdoor use:

- *Use your hardy holiday tree as a decorative accent to any porch or entryway of your home or office, than plant it in the ground after the holidays. Keep plants in their container until you are ready to plant.

Wintering over: *(not guaranteed)*

- *Pick your planting spot in the fall prior to the ground freezing. Dig your hole and mulch it to keep it warm and unfrozen, so planting your tree is easier when the plants comes out of the house. Dig a hole 1.5x wider and no deeper than the container, amend the soil taken out of the hole with compost and backfill with the mixture. Heel the plant in well to stabilize it and to remove any air pockets in the ground and water thoroughly.
- * If the ground is frozen when you remove your plant from the house or displayed area outdoors, store it outside on a protected side of your house right next to the house. Protecting the root system heavily with mulch to prevent rapid root system freezing and thawing. Plant as soon as possible in the spring.
